Animal Production Systems Update


As previously reported, Year 11 ATAR students have been working hard with myself and Mr Bertuola to observe the impact of gender on the rate of weight gain in the College cross bred chicks that were hatched at the start of term. Upon analysis of the data it appears that the females gained weight faster overall and these hens will end up forming part of our laying program once they point of lay. The Year 12 ATAR Students are in the process of analysing data from a previous Prime Lamb trial which examined the impact of dietary protein and carbohydrates on weight gain in store lambs. Both classes are in the process of completing a scientific report discussing their independent findings which assists them to develop their skills in analysing data and determining the reliability of data which are critical skills for anyone involved in Agriculture. The Year 12 General students have just completed a unit on Animal Health which required them to gain an understanding of animal health and biosecurity as well as conduct a Case Study on a specific pest. The students were able to conduct targeted research into their chosen pest, enabling them to recognise symptoms, understand how the pest spreads as well as design their own Integrated Pest Management Program to control and/or prevent an outbreak of this pest. This deeper learning should support their practical application of pest control measures, both at the College and in their future endeavours and they have created some fabulous posters summarising their findings.



This term, the Year 11 General students studied dryland salinity in Animal Production Systems and investigated if the College farm is being affected by salinity. The students had the question, "Is the water safe for livestock to drink?" To find out, we took one of the new

buses to visit the water points around the College grounds. We collected samples from water troughs, dams, natural soak, creek and lake. We then brought the samples back to the lab to compare with a control sample of Distilled Water. Students conducted Water Quality tests by testing the Salinity, Chlorine, Bromine and pH levels for safe livestock drinking levels. Student also investigated the amount of salt each of our livestock types on the farm can tolerate and compared this to the readings gathered from the water sources.






