This week, I thoroughly enjoyed being back in the classroom as a relief teacher for some Phys Ed classes. The Year 11 students really amazed me with their mixed netball skills. With Mrs Joy, the

chaplain, umpiring (and she is pretty strict), I saw some excellent teamwork with some very fast pickups and great defence from both teams. It was great to see the students willingly adapt to playing with new teammates.

The Year 11 Short Courses were a great success last week. I had some extremely positive feedback about the students' attitude and enthusiasm towards learning new skills. The relevant certificates for Defensive Driving will be arriving at the College soon and Miss Sjollema and I will be organising some online support for the First Aid course after school on Tuesday 15th of August. Remember, that students only have a 30-day window of opportunity to finish the theory part of

this course. If students have already completed their First Aid certificates, they need to submit a copy of their certificates to admin so we can keep them for our files.

HEAD OF TEACHING & LEARNING - Leanne Sjollema



Another busy few weeks has seen students completing a range of learning activities, from collecting data for plant investigations in the rain, to analysing novels, and learning about how to meet market specifications in red meat production systems.

Year 12 classes have been busy and humming with activity as students work through content, analyse superheroes and everyday heroes, learn new skills in sports such as badminton or design coaching programs for their peers in Physical Education Studies. Year 12 Plant Production Systems have been learning about Integrated Pest Management, while Year 11 Animal Production Systems have been experimenting with zoonosis and hygiene. Year 10 HPE has been focused on Safe and Respectful Relationships and Health, explore the experience of Australians during World War II during HASS, and in English they have now completed their study of Red Dog and are moving on to a new topic.

Keeping on top of assessments can be tricky, so please contact your child's teacher if you feel your child may need more support or if you have any questions regarding Class work.

The change of end date for Year 12 has necessitated a change in submission dates for the final assessments. It has been great to see students taking up the opportunity for additional support during quiet time over the past few weeks as well as attending after school tutoring in order to complete tasks quickly and to the best of their ability. As a result of the change, all Year 12 students are required to complete their End of Year Examinations during Week 10. These exams will be condensed into one week and will not be accessible early. If your child has a reasonable cause for being absent during this week, please contact me so we can schedule a date for them to sit these exams in Week 1 of Term 4 as these exams contribute towards your child's completion of their Year 12 classes.

YEAR 11 PREFECT - Natalie Bradford



I was lucky enough to get accepted into the Curious Minds program in December last year. Since then, we did a six-month coaching course with a woman working in the STEM (Science Technology Engineering and Maths) industry. In that time, we did research into our own personal projects. I chose to research

germination of crops in acidic soils, where I did an experiment with magnesium silicate, calcium silicate, lime, and hi-cal lime. I found that magnesium silicate helped most of the crops germinate with a 95% germination rate with the compound.

In the first week of the holidays, I travelled to the University of Adelaide for the week with Curious Minds to share my experiment with other students as well as learning more about STEM and how important it is for future growth. We did classes in the different areas of science which were run by experts in that field. I found it extremely beneficial as it gave us a taste of subjects that aren't always an option to study in high school.

I loved the program I would recommend it!

The Year 12 students stayed on-site for a day of presentations and workshops focused on life after



ATKINSON BROTHERS' ANNUAL BURSARY

Cliff (1990-1991), Matt (1992-1993) and Simon (1995-1996) Atkinson attended Narrogin Agricultural College (as it was known then) from humble beginnings and have gone on to have successful careers within and outside of agriculture, which they attribute to the College setting them up with the skills and attitude to succeed. The intent of the Atkinson Brothers' Annual Bursary is to encourage and support passionate young people to embark on a career by assisting in their education at WA College of Agriculture - Narrogin.

To contribute to the development of future WA College of Agriculture - Narrogin students, the Atkinson Brothers are offering each year a \$3,000.00 Bursary to a Year 11 student going into Year 12 to defray costs associated with boarding and / or course fees. The student will receive half of the scholarship at the start of Year 12 and the remainder at the start of Semester 2 in Year 12; provided they continue to meet the expectations and eligibility criteria. Bursary funds will be paid to the College. The recipients' school and boarding fees will be debited from these funds. Unspent scholarship funds will be returned to the funding body unless the recipient has been approved by the Bursary Selection Panel to expend surplus funds for a learning activity related to the objectives of the Bursary.

Eligibility

Currently enrolled in Year 11 at WA College of Agriculture - Narrogin

Not in receipt of Assistance for Isolated Children (AIC)

Selection Criteria

Demonstrated positive work ethic, enthusiasm and a high level of performance in all components of the course and willingness to keep learning.

Demonstrated ability to overcome personal adversity.

Demonstrated desire to succeed in life.

Expectations of the bursary recipient

Will maintain a positive and productive approach to their learning and involvement in the College.

Will have an attendance record of 90% or better.

Will maintain satisfactory effort across all subjects and learning areas according to school reports.

Will do a presentation about their Agricultural College experience to the selection panel of the bursary at the end of Semester 1 and 2. The presentation may be written, video or in-person.

Application Process

Students intending on applying for the Bursary must write a covering application letter addressing the selection criteria and supply the following documents:

- School Reports
- Resume
- Two references

Students will be short-listed by the Bursary Selection Panel and the short-listed students will be required to attend a face-to-face interview.


