With harvest well underway, Year 11s on work experience and Year 10 students finalising assessments, I would like to remind parents of the importance of your child attending school or school related activity on a regular basis, unless they are unwell. When a student's attendance falls below 90%

or is identified as a concern, the Student Attendance in Public Schools policy and procedures requires the school to investigate the reasons for a student's absence, discuss with parents and implement strategies for improvement that are linked to the causes of absence.

Why is going to school so important?

- At school, many concepts such as literacy and numeracy are taught in a sequence. Missing school means missing out on learning – which can often make it difficult to catch up later.
- Practical lessons are difficult to make up and could result in your child failing to complete their Certificate course work.
- Going to school every day helps teens learn the important life skill of 'showing up' – at school, at work, to sport and other commitments.

The following information has been provided to assist you in supporting your child, and the college, if there are concerns regarding attendance.

When is it OK to not go to school?

An OK reason is one that prevents your child from getting to school. This could include:

- your child is unable to attend because they are sick
- attending cultural or religious observances such as sorry time and funerals
- an unavoidable medical appointment
- an unavoidable natural event such as flood waters or a cyclone

It's NOT OK to miss school if your child:

- is celebrating a birthday
- is going on a family holiday
- is visiting family and friends
- has slept in or had a big weekend
- is looking after other children

- has sport or other recreational activities that have not been approved by the school
- has appointments such as haircuts and minor check ups
- is helping with seasonal work, at home

If possible, routine medical and other health appointments should be made either before or after school, or during the school holidays.

The Principal decides if the reason given for your child's absence is acceptable.

Do you need to let the school know if your child will be away from school?

Yes, you need to let the school know the reason why your child is going to be, or has been, absent from school as soon as possible. Where possible, please discuss any upcoming absences in advance so we can let you know of important learning or activities your child will miss out on.

This requires a responsible person, usually a parent, to provide a reason for the absence within three school days.

Having information about why your child is missing school helps us plan for their return to school and work out whether we can provide any further help to you.


and engaging in some impressive public speaking.

Secondary schooling scholarships



APPLICATIONS NOW OPEN FOR 2024

Do you know a student who is deserving of financial support?

Secondary schooling scholarships for 2024 are now open for applications through the Department's website.

A range of scholarships are on offer, including scholarships for students who:

- attend a country school,
- attend a Perth public school,
- live in the Fremantle area,
- attend Cannington Community College, Kent St SHS or Como Secondary College, and/or
- has a parent/caregiver with a disability related to spinal or limb paralysis or limb loss.

Our scholarships support all years of secondary school, with most open to students currently completing Year 10 or 11 and continuing towards their WACE. In addition, students currently in Years 6 - 9 at your school may be eligible for one of the 2 specific scholarships below:

- James and Rose Coombe Scholarships for regional and remote students. A number of these scholarships are available each year and successful applicants can reapply in subsequent years. The funding amount starts at \$1 000.
- Maud Zervos Education Grants for students with a parent/caregiver who
 has a disability related to spinal or limb paralysis or limb loss. A 'rollover
 clause' in this scholarship makes funding available for every year of
 secondary study, subject to satisfactory progress. The funding amount
 starts at \$750 in lower secondary and rises to \$1 000 for upper secondary
 studies.

Applications for our scholarships close on Thursday 7 December 2023 at 5:30pm

This course is delivered over 18 months on-campus and online in Fremantle and Broome Campuses. This course consists of 25 units of study and 440 hours of clinical placement, over three stages, undertaken in various healthcare settings. After being awarded Diploma of Nursing qualification, you can apply for registration as an enrolled nurse with the Nursing and Midwifery Board of Australia.
